## Commonsense Steps to Successful Decoration

It is also a good idea for parents to give their children some sort of say in & responsibility for how their rooms are going to look, because then it puts the onus on the kids to look after them.

**Study the rooms themselves.** How much light does each room receive at different parts of the day?

This will influence your decoration and probably the priority of your budgeting. The important thing is to see your house as a whole, rather than as a series of disjointed parts.

Be well advised to seek the advice of a professional when it comes to interiors. Their advice can save you a lot of time, money and frustration. They will have a plethora of knowledge of what is available and where to find it.

Don't be afraid to ask for samples, especially fabric samples. If you're investing some serious money in upholstery, you need to be sure it will look right in the room. For a small fee and a small, returnable deposit, give your address and ask to be lent sample books if you will return them by the afternoon of the same day. This can save a lot of time and money in the end. A decorator will also be able to obtain cutting of fabrics and samples of wallpapers to use at home and during your selections.

**Write it down.** Write all your ideas down on paper. This way others can see what you are planning – even if they are vague ideas. This will help you form your choices into concrete decisions.

Beg, borrow and steal every decorating magazine you can lay your hands on. If something makes you stop on a certain page – pull it out or mark it. You still will have to operate within the constraints of your budget, but this type of sourcing is a very inspirational place to begin and will help you to formulate your own decorating direction & style.
