Job Skills Work For Students

Mornington Secondary College's Vocational Education and Training (VET) program continues to offer students opportunities to gain valuable workplace skills and qualifications while completing their academic studies. The College has an outstanding reputation for delivery of VET, school based apprenticeships as well as an extensive VCE and VCAL program. Over the past three years our school based apprentices have won State and National awards for their VET achievements.

VET programs continue to provide students with broad opportunities for their future.

"VET courses enable students to gain their VCE and a TAFE Certificate II or III qualification" according to School Principal, Mrs Sarah Burns. "VET develops an awareness of the world of work and students gain valuable job skills in communication, team work, technology and OH&S."

VET programs are available to all students aged 15 years and older and are offered in the fields of Agriculture, Allied

Health, Automotive, Beauty, Hairdressing, Hospitality, Building and Construction, Clothing Design & Production, Community Services, Dance, Electrical, Engineering, Cabinet Making, Laboratory, Retail, Multimedia and Sport and Recreation (AFL Football, Soccer and Fitness).

Students in VET usually complete a work placement which may include a part-time apprenticeship or traineeship. Employers who are interested in offering work placements are invited to contact the school and may wish to attend the Beacon Program breakfast which brings together students, businesses and employers involved in our VET program.

Woodleigh is a school that nurtures individual students' abilities and interests – not as an additional program, but through its everyday curriculum and philosophy.

The Woodleigh education model is enriched with student choice. For 3 sessions each week, students from Years 7-11 participate in the Activities program, unique to Woodleigh School. A huge range of cross-age, inter-disciplinary activities are offered, activities which move students beyond their normal realm, allowing them to undertake an experience that would not normally be available to them.

Woodleigh Teachers offer a curriculum which extends the capabilities of students with projects that encourage independent learning at a pace suited to a student's own needs. The School has students participating in programs that cater for their need for acceleration; students completing VCE subjects while in Year 10; students undertaking university subjects while still at school. But Woodleigh School is more than just about academics – our goal is to develop the whole person and foster a love of life-long learning.


